## 22 Years of Hope, Opportunity, and Successful Outcomes

Since 2001, Children's Scholarship Fund Philadelphia has been changing lives by providing parents the opportunity to select a safe, quality school for their kids. We do this by offering scholarships to Philadelphia families in financial need so that their children can attend tuition-based schools that meet their educational needs.

Now CSFP is launching a bold plan for growth. Our aim is to serve *more students longer* by removing our four-year restriction on scholarships and retaining more of our scholars through 8th grade, while still providing up to 2,000 new scholarships annually. This campaign, with its historic goal of \$100 million, will be essential to our plan. We ask you to join in making it the transformative success we know it can be.

In doing so, you will be helping to break unjust barriers far too many Philadelphia children face—barriers to access, barriers to achievement, and barriers to the prosperous and fulfilling lives they and their families dream of.


### Our Mission and Vision

At CSFP, our reason for being is to address a single critically important problem: the educational disparities experienced by so many children in the City of Philadelphia. Despite recent progress and the efforts of many committed people, 75% of Philadelphia public K-8th grade schools rank among the lowest performing in the state.

CSFP's answer is to empower families to choose and afford a safe, quality school for their children. We provide financial assistance to under-resourced parents so that their children in grades K-8 can attend better schools — *the schools of their choice*. It is parents who select the best match for their child's needs from the 156 diverse, quality schools in CSFP's regional network. And because CSFP awards partial scholarships, parents participating in our program also make a significant financial investment in their students' educations —and in fulfilling their own hopes and dreams for their children.

To date, CSFP has awarded scholarships to more than 30,000 students. The majority of these have been made possible by support of CSFP through Pennsylvania's Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) and the Opportunity Scholarship Tax Credit (OSTC) programs. Now, as CSFP works to increase funds for scholarships, we are also securing philanthropic investment in a range of other forms as well.

## Our Reach and Impact

The key focus of CSFP's scholarship program and the supporting services we provide is to prepare our scholars to gain entry to the high schools of their choice, to thrive once they have enrolled, and to achieve their educational and life goals in the years beyond.

Research clearly indicates that a scholarship in 8th grade provides the steppingstone to later outcomes, including higher rates of college attendance. This is why we contend that CSFP reaches students in the earliest and most important years of their education.

At CSFP, we operate with a laser focus on outcomes, and the data we gather have strongly validated our impact. However, we also recognize the importance of impacts harder to quantify. We know that good schools offer not only strong academics, but also enriching, horizon-expanding opportunities in the arts, community service, sports—and that nearly 100% of our students take advantage of these opportunities.

We know that many offer advantages ranging from professional counseling to extended school days, to a foundation in faith-based values. And we know that our partner schools performed exceptionally well in facing the challenges of the Covid pandemic. By spring 2021, 99% were open for in-person instruction, helping mitigate the learning loss so many students across the city and nation experienced.

### Our Plan for **Growth**

CSFP is committed to extending scholarship support to more of the students in our city who do not have access to a quality school, who could benefit enormously from our program, and whose families are eager for that opportunity. Specifically, our goal is to serve 7,700 scholarship students per year by 2027, up from more than 5,800 currently.

We will reach this goal by continuing to award new scholarships and discontinuing our policy of limiting scholarships to four years so that we can increase retention rates and keep more students through 8th grade. In addition, a new three-tiered scholarship system will lead to more dollars in the hands of students.

Twenty-two years ago, the intent of the four-year restriction was to ensure limited funds were distributed equitably. In practice, however, we found that the limit presented a barrier to families, unsure if their scholarships would be renewed, sometimes hesitant to reapply, and fearing a painful transition if their children could no longer attend the schools they had come to love. For this reason, securing additional funding to ensure that each CSFP scholar is supported through 8th grade is a core priority of this campaign.

In addition, we will be strengthening support services CSFP provides, from our parent-toparent mentoring program to guidance in the school selection and application process, to assistance to families in financing academic summer camps.



**Invest in Philadelphia**, a city whose health and growth tomorrow depend in large measure on how well we educate our young people today.


**Invest in equity**, because there is no better path to breaking intergenerational cycles of poverty than through education—in fact, there may be no other way at all.
