

ABOUT CSFP

Since 2001, Children's Scholarship Fund Philadelphia (CSFP) has been changing lives by providing scholarships to under-resourced Philadelphia families so they may have the opportunity to select a safe, quality, tuition-based school for their children. CSFP scholarships prioritize those in the most financial need and are offered via a random lottery. The organization also offers camp scholarships, family events, and more.

OUR MISSION

CSFP is a privately funded program whose mission is to provide children from under-resourced Philadelphia families with financial access to quality, safe, K-8th grade tuition-based schools, thereby increasing their long-term economic and social success. CSFP grants need-based, partial scholarships through a random lottery. CSFP currently serves more than 6,500 children enrolled at more than 150 parochial and private schools. CSFP prioritizes K-8th grade scholarship opportunities because foundational education is critical for students to foster their cognitive abilities, build social behavior, and develop the skills needed to succeed.

OUR VISION

We seek to address the educational disparities experienced by so many students in the City of Philadelphia, thereby increasing their long-term economic and social success. Through scholarships, we will break unjust barriers to educational access, achievement, and the ability for Philly kids to live prosperous, fulfilling lives.

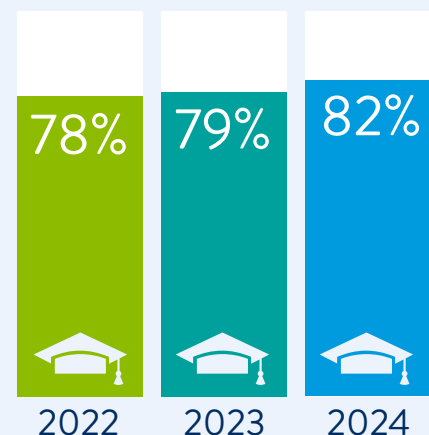

Beyond awarding new scholarships each year, it is crucial to retain students who are already in CSFP's program.

Each year, we monitor the number of students who reaffirm that they will continue attending a CSFP partner school. The chart to the right demonstrates CSFP's increased retention of scholars in the program for the past several years.

DEAR FRIEND OF CSFP,

2024 was an extraordinary year for CSFP! We served more students than ever before, providing scholarships for 6,500+ students, and increasing our scholarship amounts so that families will receive more support to meet tuition costs in 2025-2026. We expanded Camp Connections scholarships to fund more students' participation in meaningful summer camp opportunities. Through expanded partnerships, the organization launched a new website, hosted more family-friendly cultural events, and released research evaluating our students' academic performance compared to their peers.

We saw many successes in 2024. We continue to balance parent feedback and data to inform our work, which led to innovations across the entire organization. Through parent feedback, we offered additional events and evaluated greater scholarship amounts. Data also showed us that there was evidence for increasing scholarship amounts, improving our digital presence, and increasing outreach. As we prepare for CSFP's 25th anniversary in 2026, we will continue to implement best practices that we've learned in an effort to continue to grow.

Our accomplishments are supported by partners like you! Thank you to our Board and Campaign Steering Committee volunteers, our donor network, our more than 150 partner schools across Greater Philadelphia, our CSFP families, and especially to other community organizations or scholarship organizations like Independence Mission Schools who are making quality education happen for Philadelphia's K-8th students. CSFP's work is possible because of our partnerships.

We are honored to work with individuals, businesses, foundations, and community organizations to empower Philadelphia families to make educational choices that are the best fit for their families. Education is personal, and as we continue to work to provide quality, safe educational options for Philadelphia's youngest learners and future leaders, we are grateful for your partnership.

PUTTING INCREASED SUPPORT TO WORK

With increased support from our Breaking Barriers donor community, CSFP has grown — from scholarships, to staff, to supplemental supports for families. We are proud that through a data-informed approach, we increased the total number of students served, provided additional Camp Connections scholarships, and expanded the number of family-centric events that are offered to the CSFP community throughout the year.

CSFP STUDENT & SCHOOL OUTCOMES REPORT

In April, CSFP commissioned a report to understand how CSFP student and school standardized test scores compare to the School District of Philadelphia and suburban public schools. The organization partnered with QREM to collect and review 4th and 7th grade testing data from the 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 school years.

This report found that CSFP students are outperforming their peers in both math and reading. The report also highlights the impact a private education has on students and underscores the quality of the education provided by CSFP partner schools.

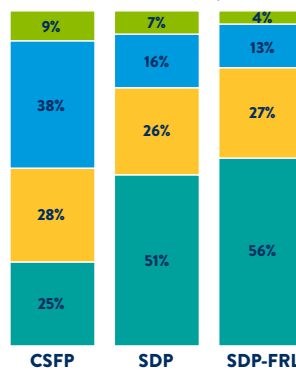

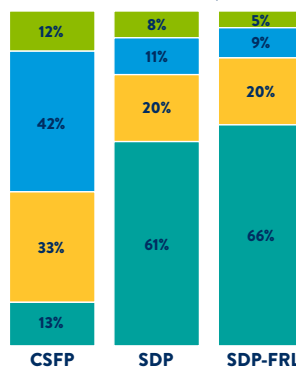
4th Grade Math Comparison

CSFP students are more likely to be proficient the longer they remain at their school — this shows that extending scholarships through 8th grade benefits our students and that the **Breaking Barriers Campaign** makes a significant difference for families and students.

This report was shared widely, resulting in 15 media placements, including *The Philadelphia Inquirer*, *Broad+Liberty*, and *The Lion*.



FAMILY EVENTS

As a result of ongoing feedback from families, the organization provided events that were focused on building connections and fostering community for CSFP parents and students. Some specific events hosted in 2024 included:

Sharing the CSFP experience with Mayor Parker

In May, CSFP hosted a roundtable discussion to share insights on education in Philadelphia with newly inaugurated Mayor Cherelle Parker. Families currently receiving scholarships were invited to attend this event and hear directly from the City's new Mayor. Five Program Ambassadors and a graduating 8th grade student joined CSFP to share their experience researching, affording, and choosing schools of choice for their families.

After the round table, attendees asked questions of the Mayor, and she, as well as then-Pennsylvania State Representative Donna Bullock (District 195) had open dialogue with attendees about school choice and other key initiatives for the Mayor. The event was hosted at Community Partnership School.

CSFP Day at the Ballpark

For the second year, CSFP invited families to celebrate our 8th grade graduates and commemorate the end of the school year. During the June event, which was sponsored by OceanFirst Bank and Exude, more than 200 CSFP families traveled to Xfinity Live! to meet each other, enjoy food and refreshments, and participate in games or activities. CSFP gave out four VIP tickets to two lucky 8th grade families to attend a tour at Citizens Bank Park and sit at field level. During the game, CSFP's President & CEO, Keisha Jordan, had the honor of throwing out the first pitch.

New Family Forum at Academy of Natural Sciences

In October, CSFP hosted its inaugural first-year family event in response to feedback asking for additional support for new families as they navigate their first school year with CSFP. The event showcased the resources CSFP offers, provided an overview how to use the CSFP Family Portal to submit paperwork and access information from CSFP, and gave families the opportunity to meet the program team, Program Ambassadors, and CSFP's President and CEO. The event took place at the Academy of Natural Sciences.



CSFP School Partner School Fair

CSFP hosted a School Partner Fair in November at the Community College of Philadelphia. Families who applied to our scholarship lottery and members of the public were invited to attend the event to learn more about CSFP's partner schools. Families had the opportunity to meet with school representatives, ask questions, and engage directly with CSFP staff and Program Ambassadors. To enhance the experience, CSFP held hourly raffles featuring swag and prizes. School supplies were given to attendees, thanks to a generous donation from United Healthcare. The event had participation from 30 schools and more than 100 Philadelphia families.

CAMP CONNECTIONS

As one of CSFP’s most popular and demanded programs, Camp Connections continued to grow in 2024, allowing CSFP to serve more students than ever!

More than 400 families entered into the Camp Connections scholarship lottery. Seventy-four students were selected to attend camp at Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts (PAFA), La Salle University STEAM Enrichment Camp, St. Joseph’s Preparatory School, Education, Sports, and Fun (ESF), and Temple University. Programs ranged from Intro to Drawing, to STEAM Enrichment, to Film Camp, and Sports labs.

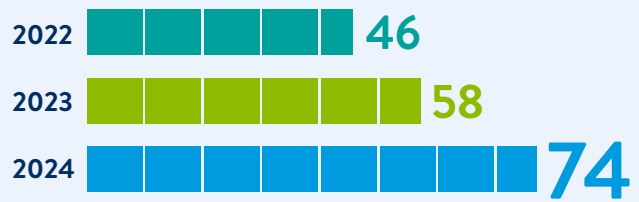

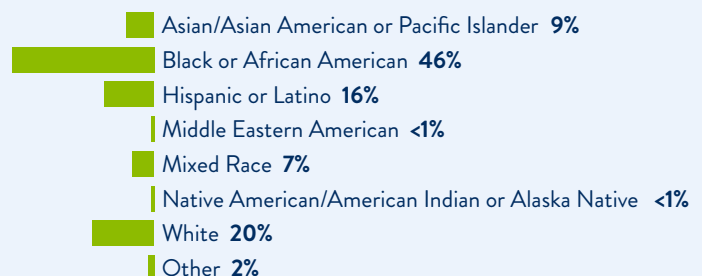

In anticipation of this life-changing event, the individual joined a CSFP managed Special Purpose Entity (SPE) so they could make a contribution that would benefit Philly Kids. **CSFP estimates that this contribution will translate into approximately 430 scholarships for students!**
